


POESPITE IT'S UNCERTAIN START THE IWW WERE HEARTENED TO SEE THE TRIUMPHOF INDUSTRIAL UNIONISM IN ACCESSION, WHERE IN 1905 A CLENERAL STRIKE OF WISKILLED

A PERFECT EXAMPLE OF AN INDUSTRIAL UNION WAS INVOLVED IN ONE OF THE IWW EARLIER STRUGGLES . IT WAS THE LOCAL 77 COMPOSED OF PRACTICALLY ALL THE TRADES OF GOLDFIELD, NEVADA.











SO THE MINERS OF LOCAL 720 SPLTI WITH THE IWW AND COCAL 77 AND WERE RE-HIRED DESPITE THE COSS OF GOLDFIELD, THE INW PROVED THAT IT WAS NOT DEAD AFTER THE SPLIT THEY MANAGED TO ORGANIZE AN ENTIRE TOWN,



BUT IN OCTOBER , 1907, THE N.Y.





HUNDREDS OF THOUSANDS OF WORKERS
WERE LEFT UNEMPLOYED. THE IWW
LED MARCHES OF THESE LABORERS

DESPITE THE SPLIT OF 1206, AND THE BREAK WITH THE WEM, AND THE HARD ECONOMIC TIMES, AND A MEMBERSHIP CEYS THAN GOOD, GOMERS WARNED UNION LEADERS OF THE IWW, NOTTHEE FUTLED BY REPORTS THAT IT WAS "DEAD AND BUSIED"



MANY WOBBLIES \* COULD IN FACT NOT VOTE, WHETHER THEY BE WOMEN OR MAINLY MIGRANT WORKERS, AND THE FOREIGN-BORN, AS THE MIGRANT WORKER HAD NO FIXED

AS THE CONVENTION ASSEMBLED, OUT OF ORELON CAME 19 NO-NONSENSE MEN AND WOMEN-VOTING MEMBERS-WHO WERE DEEMED THE IWW RED OVERALLS BRIGADE. THEY IMMEDIATELY SIDED WITH ST. SOHN AND TRAUTTMAN





WOBBLY URGANIZING

BELIEVED IN THE SOLIDARITY

IN THE SOUTH

AND DIDN'T BUY INTO THE "YELLOW PERIL"

AFTER THE STRIKE A NEW SOCIETY WOULD ARISE, RULED BY WORKERS UNIONS, IN WHICH ALL WOULD BE A "USEFUL PRODUCER" AND A MEMBER OF THE O.B.U. IT WAS A CONTESTED SUBJECT. 

### GLASS STRUGGLE






SAID ONE MIGRANT WORKER:

You ask me why the IWW is not patriotic to the United States If you were a bum without a blanket, if you had left your wife and kids when you went West,... if you slept in a lousy, sour bunkhouse,... if every person representing law and order and the nation, beat you up, and railroaded you to jail, and the good Christian people cheered and told them to go to it, how the HELL do you expect me to be PATRIOTIC?!

A POPULAR PHRASE AMONG WOBBLIES
WAS "DIRECT ACTION", AN UNCLEAR IDEA, BUT DEFINED AS
"DEALING DIRECTLY WITH YOUR
BOSS THROUGH YOUR LABOR
UNION, AND NOT GOING THRUGH
THE COURTS OR LEGISLATURE



ONE FORM OF DIRECT ACTION WAS THE STRIKE AT WHICH WOODLIES WERE PARTICULARLY INVENTIVE. DURING STRIKES, THE IWW USED MASS PICKS
ETS AND PARADES
THROUGH TOWN





THE HELP OF LABOR SYMPATHIZERS WAS TAKEN, AND SOUP KIRHENS WETE SET U AFTER THE STRIKE WORKERS KEPT ON ORGANIZING INSTEAD OF DISBANDING



UNLIKE OTHER UNIONS THE IWW CONDEMNED CONTRACTS WITH THE BOSS AS A "UN-HOLY ALLIANCE"

AT THESE STRIKES AND IN ALL OTHER WOBBLY EVENTS. MANY SONGS WERE SUNG, WRITTEN BY WOBBLY SONGWRITTERS. THEY PROVED TO BE EFFECTIVE ORGANIZING TOOLS.

THESE SONGS WERE FIRST COMPILED IN 1909 IN THE "LITTLE LED SONGBOOK"





IT WAS SAID THAT SONGS WERE MORE EFFECTIVE TO GET TO THE WORKER, "WHILE THE IN TELLECTUALS WERE LEFT IN THE HALLS. CHEWING ON VOLUMES OF KARL MARX"

THE MOST FAMOUS WORBLY SOND-WRITER WAS JOE HILL, A SWEDE. WHO WORDTE DOZENS OF WITTY SONES THAT ARE STILL SUNG TODAY. HE WAS EXECUTED IN UTAH ON TROMPSO-UP CHARGES OF MURDER



(1877-1915)

"Joe writes songs that sing, that lift and laugh...He has crystallized the organization's spirit into imperishable forms, songs of the people-folk songs" -E.G. Figure

WITH THESE INFLENTIAL, AND OFTEN WARKING SONGS THE IWW BECAME THE ONLY REVOLUTIONARY MOVEMENT NOTED FOR ITS SENSE OF HUMOR



## 12LIEADERSHIP

PROMINENT SPEAKERS AND ORG-ANIZERS, IT'S 1905 MANIFESTO SAID THAT "ALL POWER SHOULD REST IN COLLECTIVE MEMBER SHIP W.D. HAYWOOD COINED THE PHRASE WE ARE ALL LEADERS"





PACIFIC CURST MEMBERS ADVOCATED

HOBOES




THESE HORSES OR STIFFS"



ANOTHER SIDE OF THE IWW WAS THE "HOME GUARD", OR WORKERS WHO STAYED IN ONE PLACE, ONE INDUSTRY INCLUDED IN THESE WAS TEXTILES.



THE TEXTILE WORKFORCE
CONTAINED MOSTLY WOMEN
AND MANY IMMIGHANTS.
THE CONDITIONS WERE
SO BAD IN THE FACIORIES
THAT 43 OF WORKERS
DIED BEFORE AGE 26.



BY 1903, SODO TEXTILE WORKERS WE'RE ORGANIZED INTO THE IWW

ELIZABETH GURLEY FLYMN, AN INW SPEAKER, WHO BEZ AN HER SPEAKING CAREER AT AGE 16, WAS IN ATTENDANCE AT WOBBLY PICNICS AND RACLIES WHERE SPEAKERS OF ALL LANGUAGES ASSEMBLED, INFOF THEIR LIMITED-ENGLISH SHOUTS WENT....



ONE OF THE BIGGEST INW TEXTILE STRIKES POOK PLACE IN LAWRENCE, MASS. IN 1912 WHERE MUCHOUT THE WORKERS WERE HUNGARIAN AW STALIAN
